Humanitarian Action



- Broadly defined as;
 - The act of providing material assistance
 - To people in need
 - Often in the form of food or material aid
 - Provided during famine, draught and natural disaster
- Humanitarian Medicine
 - Addresses the human consequence of crises such as conflict, disaster, or displacement, and serves to assist those whose lives and health are impacted by such events (Kravitz 2020).

To ensure respect and address suffering for all people

- Endorsed in General Assembly
 - Resolution 46/182 (1991)
 - Resolution 58/114 (2004)

NEUTRALITY

Humanitarian actors do not take sides in hostilities. Not guided by political, racial, religious, or ideological considerations.



HUMANITY

Human suffering is addressed wherever it is found. Protects life, dignity and health by ensuring respect for human beings.



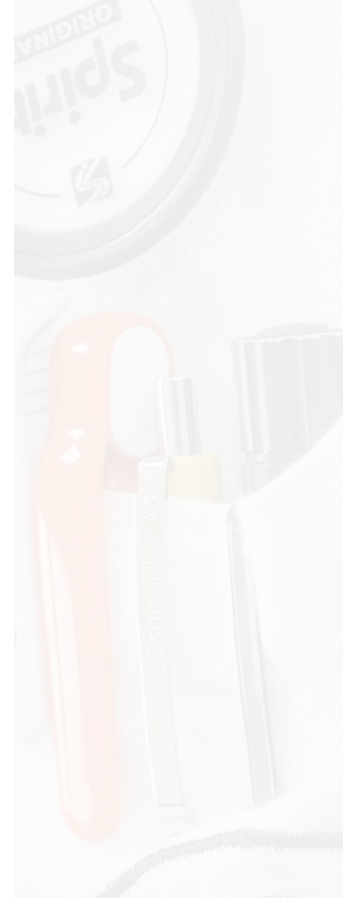
INDEPENDENCE

Autonomous from political, economic and military or other objectives held by any actor. **Not subordinated to the objectives of fighting parties.**



IMPARTIALITY

Guided on the basis of need alone. Gives priority to the most urgent cases without making distinctions based on nationality, race, gender, religion, or political opinion.

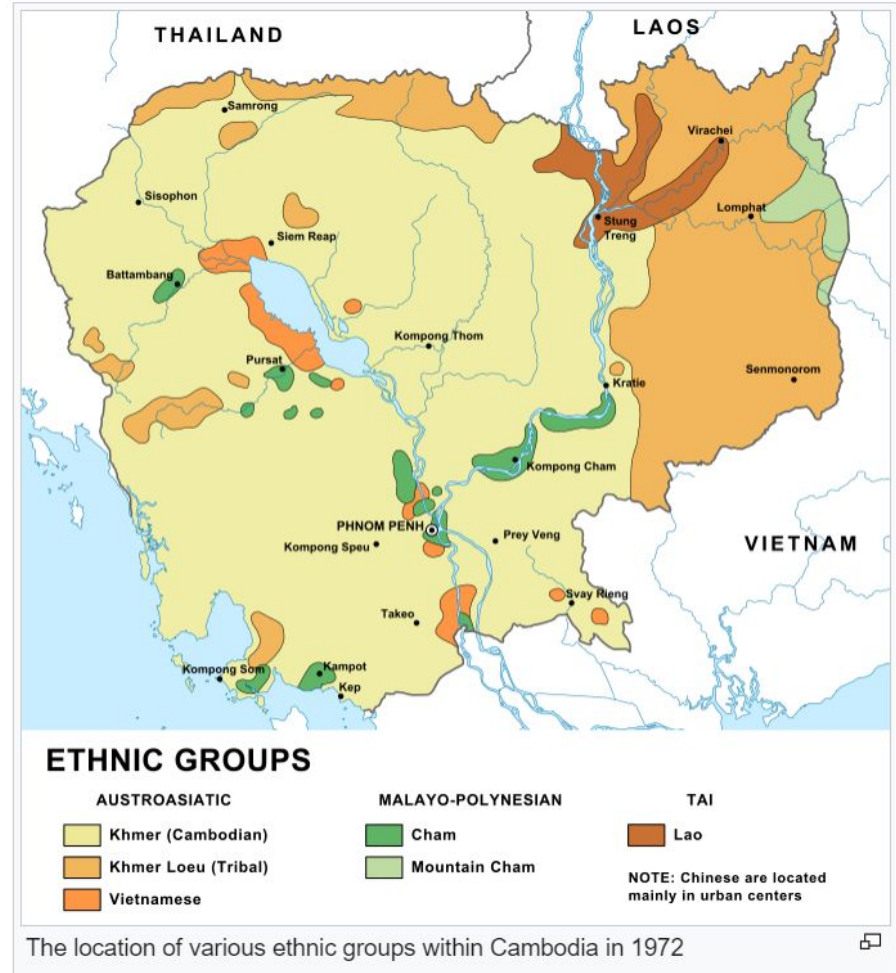

 - Approximately 90% of the total population



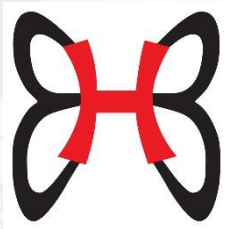

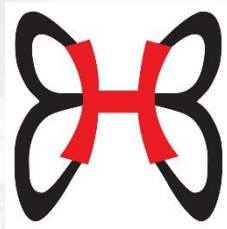


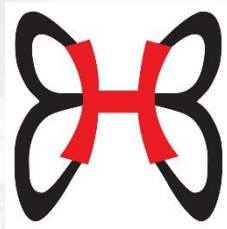




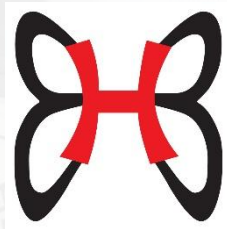


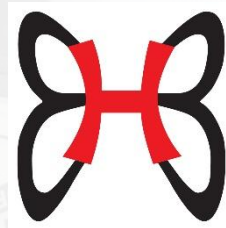


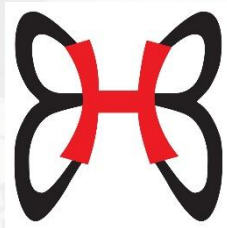


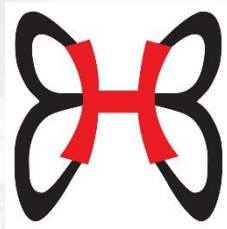


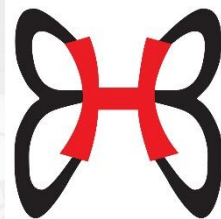




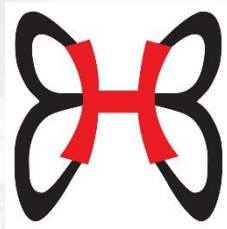


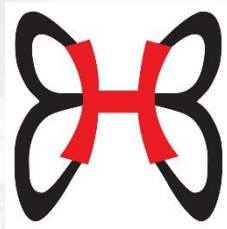




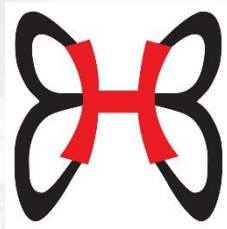


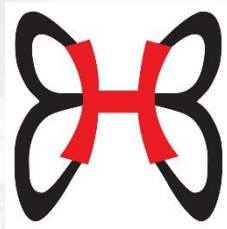














Our Mission and Vision

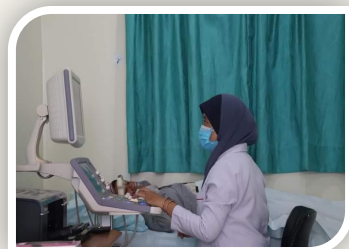




Core Value
